INDICATOR / PROFICIENCY LEVEL		People and communities have aspects of continuity but experience some degree of change over time. Continuity refers to a society's ability to hold on to what is important, to remain stable, anchored. Change refers to a society's ability to adapt and make the adjustments necessary to protect and advance the society. The following are aspects of continuity and change:

INDICATOR		Change is generally continuous, not simply discrete events happening at their own pace, and are often determined by "turning or tipping" points. <u>Virtual Field Trips</u> Grade 1 - Life Long Ago
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INDICATOR		Progress and regression are one of several ways of determining change. <u>Virtual Field Trips</u> Grade 1 - Life Long Ago
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INDICATOR		Continuity is the connection between events, ideas or beliefs over time. <u>Virtual Field Trips</u> Grade 1 - Life Long Ago
